

UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT FOR

APPROVES PRO HAC VICE FEE

Effective August 1, 1998, a fee of \$50 will be required to be paid to the Clerk, U.S. District Court for each individual applicant in each individual pro hac vice admission. This is an amendment to LR83.2 of the rule for Visiting Attorneys. The amendment to LR83.2, with the changes underlined is as follows:

LR83.2 Visiting Attorneys.

Whenever it shall appear that a person, who has not been lawfully licensed and admitted to the practice of law in the State of West Virginia, has been duly licensed to be admitted to practice before a court of record of general jurisdiction in any other state or country or in the District of Columbia, and is in good standing as a member of the bar of such jurisdiction, he or she may appear in a particular action, suit, proceeding or other matter in this Court upon full compliance with the requirements of Rule 8.0 (Admission Pro Hac Vice) of the Rules for Admission to Practice adopted by the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia, and as the same may hereafter be amended, if like courtesy or privilege is extended to members of the West Virginia State Bar in such other jurisdiction. The admission process to be followed by the visiting attorney shall be in compliance with Rule 8.0(b) of the Rules for Admission to Practice adopted by the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia, as this Rule may hereafter be amended, and the responsibility of the local attorney to be associated with the applicant shall be as set forth under Rule 8.0© of said Rules for Admission to Practice, as the same may hereafter be amended; provided however, a fee of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) shall be paid to the Clerk of this Court for each individual applicant in each individual pro hac vice admission, which fees shall be administered by the Court pursuant to applicable policies and procedures of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts as the same may be hereafter amended. The pro hac vice admission fee shall accompany a verified statement of application for pro hac vice admissions which application form shall be obtained from the Clerk.
